ABOUT THE CHILDREN'S CARDIOMYOPATHY FOUNDATION

The Children's Cardiomyopathy Foundation (CCF) is a national non-profit dedicated to finding causes and cures for pediatric cardiomyopathy, a chronic and potentially life-threatening heart disease.

The Foundation started in 2002 with one family's determination to call attention to a poorly understood disease and to take action on the lack of medical progress and public awareness. Sixteen years later, CCF has grown into a global community of families, physicians, and scientists focused on improving diagnosis, treatment, and quality of life for children with cardiomyopathy.

The proceeds from Night for a Cure will go toward funding research to improve outcomes for children with cardiomyopathy and providing support services for their families.

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
